The new office is located at the rear of All Pilgrims Christian Church at 509 10th Ave E in the Capitol Hill neighborhood of Seattle. It is only three blocks from the Capitol Hill Metro Transit Light Rail Station and is a block away from bus stops serviced by Metro buses #49 and #60. If you choose to drive, there is free two-hour parking to the east of 10th Ave E. in the residential area. There is also two-hour metered parking around the church.

What is AWSC Anyway?

What, you ask, is AWSC besides another indecipherable Al-Anon acronym? I'm glad you asked! Here is a very unofficial explanation. Please refer to your Service Manual for complete descriptions of the membership and work of an AWSC. Pages 155-156 are a good starting point.

The letters AWSC stand for Area World Service Committee, and the first thing to note is that this is an Area function. Our Washington Area AWSC meets twice a year, in February and August, to plan for the general improvement of the Area Assembly and Groups.

The people who make up the AWSC are the Area officers (Delegate, Alternate Delegate, Chair, Alternate Chair, Secretary, and Treasurer), Area coordinators

(Alateen, Alateen Safety, Archives, Group Records, Literature, Newsletter, Public Outreach, Area Alateen Conference Chair, Website, and Custodial Archivist), Al-Anon Information Service (AIS) liaisons, and all of our District Representatives. In addition, there may be a Northwest Regional Trustee and past Delegates who choose to attend.

The AWSC meetings run much like our Area Assemblies, but with fewer people present. Minutes are read and approved, reports are given, Area and District matters may be discussed, and motions are presented. The big difference is that the motions voted on at AWSC are not "decided" as courses of action, but are merely recommendations to send them on to the Group Representatives to vote on at the next Assembly. Questions that may be considered are focused on the construction of the motion. Is there adequate background information? Is the motion written concisely but thoroughly, covering all necessary points without being too wordy? Is this the right time for our Area to vote on this piece of business?

WA Area AWSC meetings last just one day and are relatively easy and fun opportunities for a District to host. A meeting room that can hold about 50 people, with a kitchen nearby, is ideal. Continental breakfast, coffee/tea/water service, and a simple lunch are all that are needed. Sometimes a nearby Alateen group or a District may offer a fundraising dinner and speaker, inviting local Al-Anon members to attend.

The August AWSC meeting will be in Sequim on August 4th. The next WA Area Assembly will be held on October 5-7th. All Group Representatives are asked to attend the Assemblies to vote on any motions brought forth at the AWSC.

My Experience: It's Easy to Order and Pay Online for Literature from AIS

2018 has seen huge changes in our Seattle Al-Anon Information Service (AIS). From the new office location to a new website AIS is moving into the 21st century to keep pace with the membership.

The new website includes a vastly improved system of ordering and paying for conference approved literature and pamphlets online.

“How’s that for a system that actually works!”

I just had the opportunity to try the new system last week and it really works!

World Service Office developed a new Al-Anon book, *Intimacy in Alcoholic Relationships: A Collection of Personal Stories*. I ordered a copy from Seattle AIS by emailing LDC@seattle-al-anon.org. The AIS Literature team emailed an invoice with a link to a payment page from a second party.

The payment page has a form to accept my credit or debit card as well as a link to let me pay with my Apple Pay™ account. I chose the Apple Pay™ option and one click did it all. Well, not quite, there is one more step with Apple Pay™. I get alerts on my phone to verify my transactions. Since I use an iPhone, all I had to do was hold my thumb on the phone’s sensor and BANG, done.

Since I was going to the office, I chose to pick up my copy but they will happily mail your books, saving you the trip to the Capitol Hill neighborhood in Seattle. The office is only open on Thursdays right now so the books are mailed on the Thursday after payment is received with most members in the Puget Sound region saying they get the books the very next day.

How’s that for a new system that actually works!

New Conference Approved Literature: *Intimacy in Alcoholic Relationships* Available Now

“Al-Anon Family Group’s latest publication, *Intimacy in Alcoholic Relationships*, covers a topic of great expressed need by our members, but seldom discussed in meetings, workshops or Conference Approved Literature. It encompasses all aspects of intimacy – physical, emotional and spiritual – in all relationships affected by the disease of alcoholism. With over 60 personal stories and dozens more brief quotations, members honestly share their challenges with intimacy, as well as the solutions they found using Al-Anon tools. Each chapter concludes with introspective questions for reflection and discussion.” (From WSO Intimacy Book Order Form)

This new book was a longtime in the making. It was first approved in 2011. But as WSO Director of Literature Tom C. wrote, “However, the big question that remained was whether members of the fellowship would step forward and share their struggles with intimacy and how Al-Anon has helped. Would members send in enough sharings for more than a brief pamphlet? Well, share they did. It took time—hence the long wait—but eventually the WSO received over 1,300 sharings. Members wrote openly and honestly, sharing facts and feelings that they might not have divulged to even those closest to them. The wide range of sharings included their experiences with emotional intimacy, spiritual intimacy and, yes, sexual intimacy.”

The first order of the new book sold out quickly at our Seattle AIS office, but another order was right behind it. We are working hard to make sure we have enough of this new publication. Also, we

have lots of the timely new pamphlet, *Hope & Understanding for Parents & Grandparents*, in stock now. Please email your orders to: LDC@seattle-al-anon.org.

How It Works For Me: Concept Eight by Newsletter Columnist Allen L.

Concept Eight:

The Board of Trustees delegates full authority for routine management of Al-Anon Headquarters to its executive committees.

My home group had a long history of dedicating one meeting topic each month to the Step and one to the Tradition for that month. Step and Tradition One were scheduled for January, number two for February and so on. Some time ago we decided to include the Concept for the same month.

I have noticed that some people think of the concepts as dry and boring or as limited solely to the management of the World Service Office (WSO). In studying the Steps and Traditions, I have discovered an expanded idea of how to apply them to my life. This expansion has come to include the Concepts as I study them in more detail.

I relate Concept Eight to the operation of my family when I was growing up. With decisions such as where to go on vacations, my mother, father, sister, and I would have a “family meeting” to discuss the options. All of us brought our opinions, wants and knowledge to the meetings. We practiced a form of knowledge-based decision making just as we do in our Al-Anon business meetings.

Now imagine how unwieldy holding a family meeting to decide on what to have for dinner every day would be. My family’s “executive committee” made up of Dad and Mom made those decisions. Mom made all the routine decisions about what to have for dinner and Dad made all the decisions about routine car maintenance, while Mom and Dad together decided which new car to buy without asking their children’s opinion.

The obvious difference is that the Executive Committee is appointed by the Board of Trustees. The Board members are selected by the members of the WSC Regional Nominating Committee while in our families the adults, hope-fully, are the leaders. The principle is similar enough though in that some things are decided by a small group that has the best interests and the long range health of the entire group in mind. Other decisions need to include everyone so that no one is left out or ignored.

Just as the Al-Anon executive committees are mindful of the wants and needs of the membership so too must I be in all my relationships. When making decisions that affect my family or friends, I want to include their desires and needs in my decision making so that EVERYONE feels included and cared about.

And who knows, they may even have a better idea than mine!

Phones Still Useful Tools of the Program Despite Changes

When talking about tools of our Al-Anon Program, phones used to be one of the first things mentioned. The phone was our number one way of communicating with fellow members outside of our meetings. It was also the way that important local program information was distributed.

Many longtime Al-Anon members have told me stories of phone trees. One member would call a few members who then had a list of members that they would call who would then call the members on their list and so on. Today by using email, websites, and texts, one person can spread the information with one push of a button.

And the phone itself has changed. Now many, if not most phones, are “smart” and mobile. They can be with us at all times whether we are at home or not. They are more powerful than the computers of just a few years ago. I have found that these improvements have made them even more useful as a program tool.

I am away from home a great deal, but I can still feel connected. While riding down the road in our van last spring, I had a call from a fellow member apologizing for inadvertently breaking my anonymity. It was no problem for me, but it could have been and I was glad that I had the opportunity to address the issue right away. I was also glad to be able to ease the mind of my Al-Anon friend in quick fashion. I think it saved her a couple weeks of fretting.

I have a hard time remembering to do things too. When I am out for one of my walks or shopping and I realize that I haven't seen a regular member of my home group for a while, I can send a quick text right then and there to touch base and let them know that I am thinking about them and have missed them. I know that I appreciate texts like that and have found that others do as well. That is also how I have found out about some difficult times they are going through and in a regular follow-up call have been able to provide a listening ear.

Recently, I was worried about a loved one. I couldn't sleep and got up at 4:00 a.m. and started writing a long text to my sponsor about why I needed to get involved in my loved one's situation. Before pushing the send button, I decided I had better proofread the text. Reading back through the text, I wondered who this crazy person was who wanted to hop out of her hula hoop! I deleted the text and replaced it with a text telling my sponsor how grateful I was for her.

Of course, I still use my phone for regular outreach calls from the comfort of my living room. I have found lots of recovery listening to and sharing with program friends. I especially appreciate calls from newcomers.

The importance of getting the phone numbers of other members is greater than ever - even if I am texting more and calling less. For me, the phone continues to be a great tool of our Al-Anon program.
