A Closer Look at Attraction vs. Promotion

Many times over the past few months I have heard members apologizing for asking Group members to help spread the word about an upcoming Al-Anon event. They often start out, "I'm sorry if this is promotion, but I really want you to know about..." Guess what? That is not promotion as defined in Al-Anon.

Another common question I hear is: Can we post Al-Anon flyers in public places like libraries and grocery stores? Yes. Just leave off any personally identifiable information such as a member's email address or phone number.

I've also heard this question: Can we have a booth at local events such as fairs and festivals? Yes. That is part of our public outreach to the community. It is sharing information about our program. And, yes, we can place advertisements in local publications.

So what does it mean in Tradition Eleven when it says: "Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, films, and TV?"

In *Paths to Recovery*, it states: *We frequently hear stories of people who heard about Al-Anon here and there, over and over, before one particular circumstance finally brought them to the door. It is our job to see that those messages will be there to be heard, seen, and read again and again if necessary until someone who needs us is ready*

Three Motions to be Voted on at WA Area Pre-Con

Three motions discussed at AWSC will be voted on by your GRs at the WA Area Pre-Conference in Chelan on April 5-6.

Motion 1: Public Outreach Coordinator Consolidation.

That WA Area ends the six-year trial started in 2013 & consolidate the WA Area Coordinator positions of Cooperating with the Professional Community (CPC), Public Information (PI), and Institutions into one position of Public Outreach Coordinator.

Prior to 2013, there were three Public Outreach Coordinator positions. On a trial basis, from 2013 to now, these three positions have been consolidated into a single position. This motion is to make this change permanent.

Motion 2: Housekeeping Motion on Travel and Lodging.

In the Transportation section of Addendum 2 of the Officer/Coordinator Expense Guideline: Area Officers and/or Coordinators with a recognized disability as defined by the ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) who require a caregiver to travel and lodge with them are not required to travel or lodge with another Area Officer and/or Coordinator. The Officer/Coordinator will be reimbursed in full for

to respond to them. Later it states: We want people to be able to find us...Tradition Eleven means doing all we can to make honest, humble, straightforward information about Al-Anon available to those who still suffer. Please help spread the Al-Anon message so others might experience the gifts of the program.

mileage, lodging and other costs incurred by the caregiver in assisting the officer/coordinator. And in the Lodging section of the same: Americans with Disabilities Act) who require a caregiver to travel and lodge with them are not required to travel or lodge with another Area Officer and/or Coordinator. The Officer/Coordinator will be reimbursed in full for mileage, lodging and other costs incurred by the caregiver in assisting the officer/coordinator.

This motion is intended to prevent undue financial burden on disabled officers and coordinators when traveling/lodging for Area business. It is an adjustment to the Officer/Coordinator expense guidelines, which have been written to encourage frugality through room and travel sharing. However, disabled officers/coordinators may have needs at odds with these stipulations. This amendment to the guidelines attempts to account for these needs.

Motion 3: Gender Neutral Language.

WA Area delegate will bring a motion to the World Service Conference (WSC) to replace male pronouns with gender neutral language in the Al-Anon Legacies.

This motion proposes our Area Delegate bring a motion to the World Service Conference (WSC) to replace male pronouns with gender neutral pronouns in the Legacies (Steps, Traditions, and Concepts). Note that the motion makes no specific description of how to change the language, nor does it discuss concepts of God. Also, note that the motion is not actually to change the Legacies (WA Area does not have that power), but rather to present a motion to WSC.

Information is really key to this motion. At Fall Assembly there was a vigorous discussion, and the Chair's consensus at the end of the discussion was that the motion should be tabled until Pre-Con because the sense was that the minority opinion had not been sufficiently heard. There were many questions about the procedures for actually changing the legacies. A 3/4 vote by all worldwide Al-Anon groups is required for this change.

To get more information on this motion, WA Area has created background documents including the comments from the last WA Area Assembly on this motion, research documentation, and a flow chart showing the path to changing a Legacy. Those background documents as well as background documents for the other two motions are available for viewing on the AIS website. I hardly painted in the intervening years; instead, I used my training and creative spark in designing and making furniture, building boats, and repurposing stuff I found at yard sales.


Life's twists and turns took me into technical writing while marriage to a sober alcoholic brought me to Al-Anon. One of those twists started me writing about my Twelve Step program.

Albert Einstein is quoted as saying that "Failure is success in progress." As a writer, I have given myself the freedom to fail. I can write my next Al-Anon article and when I finish, discover that it's just dreadful! But since you as my reader have not seen it yet, I can edit it, rewrite it, or even throw it away. But in writing and failing, I captured the seed of the next version that was often successful.

Much of life is irrevocable. We can't take back a hurtful word or somehow show up on time once we are late. But in writing, I have the luxury of correcting my mistakes. That's one of the reasons that journaling can be such a powerful tool. I can say what is in my heart in the moment. The moment when I am angry or hurt. I can be brutally honest without being brutal since no one but me or maybe my sponsor will ever get to see what I have written.

Embracing failure as a learning tool in my writing has helped me to accept failure in other areas of my life as part of the process, not as a final measure of my self-worth. I may have failed in this attempt to reach my goal, but just as in my writing, I am free to make a new start. That is how I practice "Progress not Perfection."

PS: I started painting again and while I may never be a famous painter, I am satisfied that my work gets better with each new painting.

I was raised in the Pacific Northwest but lived a couple decades in a sunnier state. This is my second Washington winter since returning, and I am having trouble on a number of fronts surviving this challenge. It seems natural to become melancholy and want to hibernate like a bear until all this gloom disappears.

Then we hit a record February cold snap complete with several pristine snowfalls followed by treacherous roadways and black ice. Right after the

the serenity to accept the things I cannot change.” I could not change the weather nor the meeting closures.

I had taken the wide variety of meetings generally available for granted! Many times this transforming fellowship has supplied my “social connections and sanity” that enables me to navigate my path. After leaving these rooms I often felt renewed strength and strategies for living a better life. Recovery and personal growth are not optional, and I needed my fellow travelers to accomplish this.

“The courage to change the things I can,” I could not expect others to take the risk and drive to the meetings. However, I could text, call, and email fellow travelers who may even be in the same isolated position. I participated in a phone meeting of one of my regular meetings, gladly spending 1.5 hours out in my car with the heater on. It was a welcome infusion of hope as I pictured each member’s face and heard the familiar laughter. A unique spiritual experience. Once I accepted the circumstances, and was able to consider viable options, I had the “wisdom to know the difference!”

How to Do a Service Workshop for Your District

Editor's Note: Recently District 20 held a Saturday workshop about service. Kathy B. volunteered to coordinate the workshop. In thinking back on the experience, she felt other Districts and Groups might find some of what she learned helpful in planning their own Al-Anon workshops.

Our Service Workshop started with a question at our District business meeting: Why is it that, even in large groups, when a Group conscience meeting or a volunteer opportunity comes up, it is a small group that responds? We decided that a Service Workshop to present how service helps our recovery was something we could do to encourage Al-Anon members to choose service. I agreed to coordinate the workshop.

My challenge was doing it “the Al-Anon way.” Planning and implementing an event was familiar to me. But I was used to doing it mostly on my own and as well as being a backup for every task to make sure it got done. I was not familiar with the idea that when we do something in Al-Anon we are all in charge and someone is always there to offer help. Each task would be carried out by volunteers and nobody would be “voluntold to do anything.”

The first help came in the form of several meetings with our DR. She found a location and a date for the workshop. Then the Group Reps in our District reviewed the list of service issues that I created after reading the booklet *When I Got Busy, I Got Better*. They discussed and decided on three issues that were prevalent for most Al-Anon Members: (1) Sponsorship, (2) Myths and Barriers to Service, and (3) You Are Perfectly Imperfect for Any Position As Long As You Are Willing.

Once we had the topics, we went to work finding speakers. To my surprise, each Al-Anon member who I asked agreed to speak and then to facilitate a discussion on their topic.

The District established a \$250 budget for food, and our DR already had napkins, plates, cups, and other sundry articles. Since there are no RSVPs in Al-Anon, I wasn't sure how many people to expect. I asked an experienced DR how many to expect. She asked me how many I thought and then said, “Half it!” She was exactly right.

On the day of our workshop, several Al-Anon volunteers helped me unload the food and water, and we hung up signs on the doors giving directions. Each attendee came in asking what they could do to help and the workshop was ready to go.

Each speaker spoke of their experience, strength and hope and their commitment to service as a tool for our recovery. After each speaker we had time to eat and to talk with each other. After all the speakers had finished, they each went to a round table, and the participants moved to these tables for a discussion on each topic. We put the key ideas on charts hung by each table and these ideas were used to write an article about what we learned. After 15 minutes the groups moved to the next table to allow them to talk about a new topic and we repeated this until all participants had an opportunity to talk and listen about each of the three topics. The notes were later sent to the BITS so that members might gain from our discussions.

The final portion of our program was reading from Conference Approved Literature before an all-group clean up.

TASK LIST FOR WORKSHOP

- Choose a date**
Group conscience on preferred date(s) after checking the 2019 Calendar on the AIS Members page to avoid conflicting with any other events of interest to its potential attendees.
- Find & confirm location available on your date**
Location will need chairs set up auditorium style and adequate tables for round table discussions plus tables for sign in, food, and drinks.
- Develop & distribute flyer**
Check AIS members page for flyer guidelines. Email the flyer to communications@seattle-al-anon.org and to all GRs in your District and ask them to help spread the word.
- Invite members to speak at the workshop**
Ask a member to share on a specific topic developed by Group conscience.
- Make direction signs**
Decide on wording for signs and make signs to be posted. You may want to print on colored paper for added visibility.
- Shopping for food and drink**
Our list included: cheese, crackers (some gluten-free), fruit, desserts, chips and salsa, and boiled eggs
- Get plates, napkins, cups, forks, platters, bowls**
Add sundries needed to shopping list
- Order topic-related pamphlets from AIS Office**
Order pamphlets by emailing LDC@seattle-al-anon.org. Place some on each round table.
- Set up tables and chairs and mic if not already done by the venue.**
Sound check the microphone and make sure key volunteers understand how it works.
- Door Greeters**
Greeters will provide directions as well as a warm Al-Anon greeting
- Registration table**
Facilitates sign in and gives out name tags
- Provide color-coded name tags for the day**
Have separate colored name tags for each break out group to facilitate the organization of the round table discussions.
- Introductions at workshop**
Ask DR if they are willing to do the introductions to include:
Purpose and topics
Logistics: restrooms, snacks, timeframe for the day, separation of trash
- Provide each speaker details and logistics for the day**
Logistics notes and timeframe to each speaker. If possible, have them involved in sound check so they are comfortable with the mic.
- Post signs in building to give directions to your room**
Provide signs from each entry door to your meeting room.
- Snack/Coffee set up and fill up**
Coffee makers, clearing tables, emptying/checking trash, fill up snack tables
- Put round table items at each table**
Colored paper, pens, one or two sheets of 3M chart paper, and markers to log key points
- Using speaker and round table notes, write article for the BITS newsletter**
Get information on requirements and timeline from BITS editor
- Clean Up and Lock Up**
Make sure everything is in order and the doors are locked if applicable

Making a Decision to Trust in My HP

Step Three: Made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him.

Before I found Al-Anon, I often felt alone. I was an only child of an alcoholic mother until age 11. My Merchant Marine dad, also an alcoholic, was gone a lot. Alcoholism negatively affected my relationships, resulting in a belief that I was on my own. I developed a coping skill that both helped me survive and hindered my development: extreme self-reliance.

Throughout my adolescence, my marriages to two alcoholics, and beyond, I was "In Charge!" Because the alcoholics in my life were unreliable and unpredictable, I learned to do everything myself, to be in control and not to depend on anything or anyone.

In 2008 a series of crises brought me to the rooms of Al-Anon. By then I was tired, sick, and very lonely. I was told right away I wasn't alone, that there was a Higher Power (HP) that was with me at all times. They said this HP was reliable, available, and loving.

This was a complete reversal of my way of thinking. I examined my long-held beliefs that HP was like my parents and that "He" was some bearded guy who never showed up. I also had to stop looking at other people's faith for an explanation of HP as I understood it.

Finally, I stopped trying so hard to figure it all out; to solve the mystery of what "Higher Power" meant, who HP was, and where I could find It. I simply made a decision! I decided to turn my will and my life over to the care of an HP that I could not understand or explain.

Gradually, the need to be "In Charge!" left me. I stopped telling my loved ones what was best for them. I stopped playing detective, judge, and jury. But, the biggest change was that I ended the story in my head that no one cared about me.

I made a decision to trust.

Recently, we had a storm with large accumulations of snow. After five days at home, I had to drive to the office. I was afraid to drive my little car on the icy, snowy roads. My first thought was "I can do this!" That was my extreme self-reliance talking. My second thought was "I am not alone! I have a Higher Power who directs and guides me!" I decided to listen to the second voice. Off we went; me and HP. I listened for guidance throughout the treacherous trip and . . . We made it just fine!

Making a decision to trust my Higher Power has transformed my life in ways big and small, understandable and mysterious. Above all, I know I am not alone.

In Giving, We Receive and *Facing Our Fears* are the titles of the first two sections in the booklet *When I Got Busy, I Got Better*. In my mind, they sum up the Al-Anon service experience for many of our members. After overcoming fears such as the fear of assuming responsibility, the fear of making mistakes, the fear of commitment, the fear of failure, or even the fear of success, we become willing to serve and in serving reap profound rewards.

This booklet is a mere 60 pages long, but a whole lot is packed into those 60 pages. The narrative content consists solely of members sharing their personal experiences with service: meaning that by reading this little gem, you get about 60 different perspectives on service in Al-Anon. I think all members will learn something about themselves in one or more of those stories.

For me, the shares about detachment and perfectionism were particularly helpful. It also emphasizes that we are not left to do jobs alone. We have other members and our Higher Power to aid us in service as we seek to follow Step Twelve: *Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these Steps, we tried to carry this message to others, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.*

- Alateen groups do not exist without Al-Anon members' support.
- Alateen meetings are run by the teens in the Group with their own Alateen literature.
- Al-Anon Members Involved in Alateen Service (AMIAS) serve as Alateen Group sponsors and must be present to hold an Alateen meeting. It is recommended that 2 AMIAS be present at each Alateen meeting.
- In order to serve as an Alateen Group sponsor an Al-Anon member: Must be attending Al-Anon meetings regularly, must have been in Al-Anon for 2 years, and must have completed AMIAS certification training.
